EXTENDED DAY



This information is applicable for the year starting September 2018 and ending August 2019

Columbia Christian School offers *Extended Day* on school days from 7-8 AM, and from 3-6 PM. We *may* also offer a half or full-day *Extended Day* program on early release or non-school days as well as special camps during school breaks. *Extended Day* is available for full-time kindergarten through middle school students.

- Elementary and Middle School students must be supervised at all times when they are on campus. Students arriving earlier than 15 minutes before school begins, or staying longer than 15 minutes after school dismisses, will be checked into Extended Day.
- Extra-curricular activities (sports, study hall, clubs, music lessons, etc.) can be coordinated with *Extended Day*.
- All students will be provided with a snack each afternoon.
- For safety reasons, a parent (or other authorized person) is required to check-in students upon arrival and check-out students upon departure.
- If a student is picked up late, there will be an additional charge (see below).

RATES

- To receive the discounted rate, families must pay ahead, otherwise they will be billed afterward at the drop-in rate.
- ✓ After 6:00 PM, the charge will be \$5.00/minute
- ✓ There will be a 10% rate discount for additional children from the same family.
- ✓ The monthly rates in November, December, January, March & June will be prorated to account for school breaks.
